The Petroleum History Society Awards for 1995

At the Petroleum history Society Noon luncheon of December 5, 1996, Society Treasurer, Clint Tippett, presented the **Petroleum History Society Awards for 1995**. These awards, made on the basis of nominations from Society Members, recognize contributions which encourage the study, communication, preservation, and enjoyment of Canadian petroleum industry history. These awards recognize significant contributions in several categories:

Best Article of the Year Award

The Best Article of the Year Award went to Cal B. Sikstrom for his article: Theodore August Link (1897 - 1980), published in Arctic, Volume 48, No. 1, pp. 96 - 98. (Reprinted in the Nov. 1996 issue of Archives).

Mr. Sikstrom's article was nominated by David Finch. In his nomination letter, Mr. Finch said, "... I nominate it for its

carefully written and conveys the spirit of an important leader in this industry."

The award was accepted by David Finch on behalf of Cal Sikstrom.

Best Book Award

The award for the best book went to **Beverley Jones** for her book, **High Heels 'n' Oil Rigs** (Caitlin Press, 196p.). In his nomination letter, Clint Tippett said: "The book records her many and varied experiences over a 10 year period as a camp cook in locations stretching from close to Calgary to the Arctic ocean. I found the book to be an interesting mix of human experiences and technical setting, entirely in keeping with the PHS's tradition of oral history.

The award was accepted by Lynn Hawker on behalf of Beverly Jones.

Best Multi-Media Award

The Best Multi-Media Award was presented to **Sharon and Stacy Stevens** for their video, **Doodlebugs: The Video** (30 Min.). Micky Gulless, said in her letter of nomination that: "This lively 30-{Continued on Page 3} minute video captured the life of a doodlebugger's family in the 1950's. Clips from home movies and old family snapshots rolled by in a theme of continuous movement, characterizing the seismic workers' gypsy lives." "The responses from the audience illustrated that this video really caught the doodlebug way of life and preserved it forever. There was plenty of laughter and people even called out their own comments at the screen! This video communicates and preserves a piece of Canadian petroleum history, in an entertaining way, and merits a PHS award for excellence."

Preservation Award

The Preservation Award was accepted by Doug Cass on behalf of the Glenbow Library and Archives. In Mr. Cass's letter of nomination, he observed: "Since the 1950s this organization (itself established by a petroleum industry pioneer) has acquired and preserved a wide-range of sources dealing with the history of Canada's petroleum industry. From the personal pages of Archibald Dingman and William Herron to the records of Royalite and Home Oil to the files of the Canadian Petroleum Association, Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists and the Independent Petroleum Association, it is a key location for research into this industry. The library holds a wide array of publishes sources including most of the standard histories of the industry and the only significant run of the important magazine the Western Oil Examiner. An examination of most publications on the history of the Canadian industry will indicate the debt of the authors to the resources at Glenbow. The Archives also holds the recordings of the Petroleum Industry oral History Project, conducted from 1981 to 1985, which was the

forerunner of the Petroleum History Society itself

Lifetime Achievement Award


The 1995 PHS Lifetime Achievement Award was presented to long-time Society member, **Jack Porter**. Bill McLellan nominated Jack "because of his lifelong dedication to preserving the history and folklore of the petroleum industry in Canada, particularly that of geologists and the Canadian Society of petroleum Geologists, through:

- his longtime (since approximately 1973) Chairmanship of the Archives and History Committee of the Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists;
- his writing, for internal publication, a detailed history of Canadian Superior Oil and Gas;
- his continuing preparation of high quality displays of old photographs, at CSPG conventions and other events, illustrating the key events and conditions in the petroleum industry throughout its history in Canada;
- his acting as a "conduit" for Officers of the CSPG and others who have papers, photographs and other artifacts of historical significance who wish them saved, often in the Glenbow Archives;
- his contagious and boundless enthusiasm and energy towards all things relating historically to Canada's petroleum industry, particularly photographs;
- his support and guidance during the formative stages of the establishment of the Petroleum History Society; and
- his continuing "presence", enthusiasm and positive involvement in all the activities and business of The Petroleum History Society."
