Downtown Calgary has a rich heritage of buildings and localities associated with many diverse industries, be they petroleum, banking, ranching, railways, government, retail or the arts. Of these, those linked to the oil and gas industry are perhaps the most numerous with many named after existing or now extinct companies.

This tour will involve a circuit past about 25 of the more important petroleum-related downtown structures and sites with stories told about each. Total distance should be about roughly 5 blocks west, 5 north, 5 east and 5 south. Participants who R.S.V.P. will receive a short guidebook that is a draft of a more comprehensive version being compiled for future use. It is hoped that those involved will share additional stories that can be incorporated into the guidebook. We look forward to seeing you.
