## The Canadian Museum of Making

A collector of machinery since childhood, lan's passion and curiosity led him to become the primary benefactor and curator of the Canadian Museum of Making which he will describe in his talk.

lan MacGregor is the Chairman of North West Upgrading Inc., a 50% partner in the North West Redwater Partnership which is constructing a \$15 billion dollar bitumen refining complex in Alberta's Industrial Heartland. The project will be the world's first to incorporate CO<sub>2</sub> management with carbon capture and storage. This approach will allow the company to produce an ultra low sulphur diesel with one of the lowest carbon footprints of any petroleum-based fuel. Ian is also Chairman of Enhance Energy Inc., which is building the world's largest carbon capture and storage system, the Alberta Carbon Trunk Line. The system will capture, transport and utilize CO2 as a feedstock for enhanced oil recovery. More than 14 million tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> will be injected annually with sound underlying economics based on oil recovery. A partner of the private investment firm North West Capital Inc., Ian has been involved as a founder and owner in a number of substantial Alberta-based companies. He also serves on the boards of a number of public, private and charitable organizations such as Calgary Municipal Lands Corporation and Heritage Park. Ian doesn't measure success solely in terms of business achievement, but through the simple principles his father and mother taught him. Teach or learn in all you do. Leave something better than when you arrived. Be kind to those around you.
