Blessed by Geology - Cursed by Geography: Canada's Energy Pipelines

by David Finch, Petroleum Historian and Author

Controversy swirls around the Northern Gateway pipeline to the West Coast and the Keystone XL line to the Gulf of Mexico today, but Canada's energy pipelines have regularly made headlines for a century. Though invisible, pipelines have often been disruptive forces, politically charged, and even out of sync with the times. They have also been fundamental to the development of the Canadian oil industry and the continental economy. This review of key pipeline developments in Canada since the early 1900's will explain their influence and power, as well as the precarious position they occupy in our Canadian economy.

Historian and author David Finch is the author of more than 25 books about the history of the Canadian West and a frequent contributor to the Calgary Herald. David is a longtime member of the P.H.S. and a P.H.S. Award winner.

Horizontal Drilling Pioneer: Does anyone remember Peter Gretener's advocacy of horizontal drilling as a way of working with geological heterogeneity and maximizing fracture intersections? Peter was a Swiss geologist who got his start with Shell Canada in the late 1950's mapping in the Northwest Territories. He later became a professor at the University of Calgary where he liked to introduce provocative ideas to his students. Peter, now deceased, would be very proud of the ways in which horizontal drilling has been implemented as a part of our exploitation of unconventional resources.

Operation Bow-Athabasca: The Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists and the Geological Survey of Canada, in conjunction with the Canmore Geoscience Centre, have produced both a travelling exhibition and a volume on this regional geological mapping project from the 1960's and early 1970's that covered the area between the TransCanada Highway along the Bow River all the way north to the Athabasca River along the Yellowhead Highway near Jasper. The book of 72 pages was authored by Ben Gadd (with contributions from Ray Price, Roger Macqueen and Rick Green), is 72 pages long, contains numerous colour illustrations as well as a DVD with many of the related final maps, and costs \$20.00. It can be purchased at the C.S.P.G. office at 110, 333 – 5 Avenue S.W., Calgary. Or if you run into P.H.S.
