Turner Valley - A Picture is worth a Thousand Words by Clinton Tippett, David Finch and Doug Cass

The growth and evolution of the Turner Valley Field are richly illustrated by the many pictures preserved in the Glenbow and Alberta Provincial Archives. In the prelude to the 100th anniversary celebration of its discovery on May 14, 1914, we have chosen to present a collection of iconic images from throughout the life of the field in order to allow for a full description of what is being depicted, to highlight similarities and differences with modern practices, and to point out aspects that might be misinterpreted in the absence of an understanding of the processes involved. The presentation will therefore be interactive with our audience on this day and we hope that the experience will be both educational and entertaining for all involved. A copy of the most recent issue of *Alberta History*, produced by the Historical Society of Alberta and dedicated to Turner Valley, will be available free to each attendee.
